

The Situation

HIRE Minnesota is working to ensure that public investments in infrastructure and renewable energy help lift people out of poverty, reduce racial disparities and contribute to healthier communities for all of us. HIRE brings people together with a vision of a new economy that works for all members of our community. Minnesota's unemployment rate is an alarming 8.1 percent, and the unemployment rates in low-income communities and communities of color are much higher. And while our public institutions are making unprecedented investments, they display a troubling pattern of failure to meet their goals for including people of color.

However, we are in an important historic moment – a moment in which we have the opportunity to change business as usual by organizing across boundaries to ensure all communities experience economic recovery equitably. With this vision, HIRE Minnesota has united more than 70 community organizations in a broad and powerful coalition to seek public investments that:

- jump-start our economy
- provide access for all people to jobs, training and living wages for low-income people and people of color, and
- promote healthy communities, including rebuilding our infrastructure and easing the climate crisis.

What HIRE Minnesota is Doing

HIRE Minnesota is working hard to pressure decision-makers to act with the best interests of our communities in mind. The good news is that because of supporters like you, HIRE Minnesota has "people power!" **Now more than ever, we need to mobilize grassroots support.**

The voices of constituents can influence legislators to create green job and infrastructure hiring opportunities for communities of color and low-income Minnesotans. HIRE Minnesota Community Gathering Toolkit: Getting Started

Planning a community gathering is not much different than planning any other gathering of your friends...you will be thinking about things like who to invite, when to have the party, what to do to make it fun, and what materials you'll need. HIRE Minnesota encourages you to think about the term "gathering" broadly. A gathering could be a brown bag lunch, community gathering, or coffee and rolls after worship service.

This planning timeline can serve as a guide for you as you plan your community gathering. Please note that this planning timeline is only an example. Gatherings can be planned in as little as two weeks, if necessary.

- 1. **Choose the date and time.** The party doesn't have to be longer than an hour or two unless you want it to be. Of course, make sure the date and time are convenient for you, but also consider community or school-related events, holidays, or spring breaks. Check those dates before finalizing your date.
- 2. **Make your invitation list.** Because we want to build people power, invite more people than you normally would. Generally, about 1/3 of the people you invite will actually come, so getting 15 people to your party means inviting 45! Consider these tips for building your invitation list:
 - Select people who will care about this issue. You don't want to accidentally host a Debate community gathering!
 - Consider co-hosting with a friend or neighbor to expand the pool of people to invite.
 - Family, friends, colleagues, neighbors, members of your place of worship, your community, or sports team are all fair game!
 - Set a goal of inviting at least 25 people who are likely to get involved in HIRE Minnesota (not just be there for the great food) to your community gathering.
- 3. Consider inviting a special "VIP" guest or speaker. This can be a great draw for people to attend the event. It could be a supportive community leader, business owner, environment activist, or person who has benefited from green jobs or infrastructure hiring opportunities and has a great story to tell. If you ask someone to make remarks, ask them to keep it to 5 or 10 minutes. Make sure your special guest supports HIRE Minnesota.
- 4. **Create and send invitations.** Feel free to be creative with your invitations a personal touch is best! Keep your invitation simple, very brief, and fun in spirit. Send one to your special guest as well.

- 5. **Make follow-up phone calls.** The key to getting successful turnout to your event is largely dependent on persistent personal contact from you, the host. A personal follow-up call will help get your guest's attention and get them to commit to coming to your community gathering. Call your special guest as well!
- 6. **Plan your refreshments**. Refreshments can be as simple as soda and chips or as elaborate as gourmet finger sandwiches—whatever is easiest and most fun for you! You can also ask your guests to bring something and turn it into a community pot-luck or brown bag meeting.
- 7. Get supporting materials from HIRE Minnesota. HIRE Minnesota can provide you with volunteer commitment cards to give to your guests.
- 8. **Confirm with your special guest.** Find out if there is anything they'll need if they are going to be speaking and be sure they have HIRE Minnesota talking points.
- 9. Make reminder calls. Make sure your guests remember to attend by giving them a reminder call. This is an essential step—don't skip it!
- 10. Show time! Have a great time at your event and be sure to thank people for coming, caring, and getting involved! Use the sign-in sheet in this toolkit to track who attends your event. Make sure everyone has a chance to fill out a HIRE Minnesota commitment card and return these completed cards to HIRE Minnesota as soon as you can.
- 11. **Report back to HIRE Minnesota about your community gathering.** Use the reporting form in this toolkit to let HIRE Minnesota know how the community gathering went. This is important because it helps us gauge how much grassroots pressure is being applied and in which districts.
- 12. **Thank you! Thank you! Thank you!** Thank you for giving your time, talent, space, and relationships to spread the HIRE Minnesota message and get people involved.

HIRE Minnesota Community Gathering Sample Agenda

A community gathering is easy and should reflect your personality and style. The important thing is to maintain a feeling of fun and get people involved! This sample agenda may give you ideas about how to keep the action moving at your community gathering:

I. Welcome and Introductions (10 minutes)

People will probably arrive at various times, but within the first 15 minutes, create a chance for people to introduce themselves to each other and get acquainted. Circulate the sign-in sheet.

II. Why we're here: (5 minutes)

Take a few moments to brief people about the situation facing Minnesota and our local community:

III. Putting a Human Face on HIRE Minnesota's Priorities (15 minutes)

Make sure you have a few stories to share about how green jobs and infrastructure hiring opportunities will affect real people. Brainstorm together about how these investments could provide meaningful and long-term impacts in your communities. Have your featured guest share a story, or call HIRE Minnesota for ideas.

IV. Why Grassroots People Power? (5 minutes)

- People are our greatest resource. Together we can build people power and demand our elected officials attention.
- We have come together to use our voices, our experiences, and a bit of our time and we will make a difference.
- While we're taking action under these critical circumstances today, we are building for our future as committed grassroots advocates.

V. Take Action- Sign up to Get Involved with HIRE Minnesota! (15 minutes)

- □ Provide a short overview of the volunteer opportunities available.
- Ask people to commit to using their time and talents to advance HIRE Minnesota's work.
- Collect completed from your guests.

VI. Thanks and Celebration! (for as long as you want)

Thank your guests! Let your guests know that this is one of many gatherings taking place in communities across Minnesota, and they are part of an exciting grassroots campaign. Celebrate! Make sure that they have all signed the sign-in sheet before they leave. Also, be sure to ask them to fill out a HIRE Minnesota commitment card and learn about more ways they can help HIRE Minnesota advance their priorities.
